NAPLAN testing for years 7 & 9 went off well last week. As a result of the last minute decision to lift the Moratorium, staff put in extra time to make sure it was seamless as possible for our students. The information received from the testing will be invaluable in helping us plan for next year and target students who need individual support to ensure their growth is positive. We as a community will need to remain vigilant in regards to how this individual student diagnostic test may be used to compare schools in the future.

I received recently a letter from Little Athletics NSW informing me that Alina Tape participated in the

ASICS Australia Little Athletics Championships. At the championships she not only competed in the 400m & 1500m walk, finishing 1<sup>st</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> respectively she was commended for her behaviour and attitude making her an excellent ambassador for New South Wales. The Macksville High School community is also very proud of Alina's efforts and would like to congratulate her on this achievement.

Last week our Open Boys' Rugby League team travelled to Kempsey to play Kempsey High School in the CHS knockout. Hospitality students in Year 11 recently attended the "Workplace Reality for Work Placement" session organised by Helen Mower, **North Coast Youth Career Connections**. The students and Hospitality teachers, Mrs Orman and Mrs O'Sullivan were joined by guest speakers, Lynette Howle and Mark Werner.

Lynette is MHS's Community Liaison Officer and Mark is MHS's Aboriginal Liaison Officer. Lynette provided students with an insight into her employment at the Holiday Inn Crown Plaza at Terrigal as Restaurant Supervisor. Lynette's advice to students was based on 5 principles: Listen, Speak clearly, Reliability, Enthusiasm and SMILE! Lynette also said it was important to remain calm in high pressure situations – don't forget to take some deep breaths!

Mark, has an extensive Employment Service background and has experience delivering the Safe Food Handling course across NSW. He emphasised the need to be aware of cross contamination of food, and the risk to pregnant women and the elderly – being most at risk. Mark's tips included – make the most of opportunities, and take advantage of work trials – a good way to find out more about your career options.

Djaran Smith, Sharni Tape, and Alina Tape represented Macksville High last week at the NSW All Schools Carnival at Homebush. This is a carnival which pits the best from all three school systems – public, Catholic and independent schools.

Djaran collected a swag of medals finishing with gold, 3 silvers, and a bronze. He is now the State champion in the 50m breaststroke. Djaran's silver medals were achieved in the 200 IM, 100 and 200 breast, and a bronze in the 100 back. Djaran has been named in the NSW All Schools team, and will travel to Brisbane in June for the National School Sport Swimming Titles. We wish him all the best of luck.

Sharni also had a successful meet bagging a bronze medal in the 50m back, and finishing  $4^{th}$  in the 50 and 100 freestyle. Alina contested 3 events and finished with a PB in the 50 fly, and in the top 6 for 50 back and 100 free.

I have identified some students involved and taken action against them. I will fully assist in the prosecution of the nonstudents that were involved.

#### SCHOOL FEES

Thank you to parents/guardians for paying school fees on time. Subject fees can be paid off during the year.

Students can pay for items at the front office before school, recess or lunch time. Money will not be receipted during class time. Payment may be made by cash, cheque or Eftpos.

#### OFFICE DUTY

Students in Yr7 have started their turn of Office Duty. This role is very important and helps enormously with getting messages around the school to students and teachers.

The students learn where all the rooms are and who the teachers are and it is part of the community of school that we aim for students to feel a part of. Students do office duty twice a year, at most 2 periods at a time.

#### SEPARATION IS A DIFFICULT TIME FOR EVERYONE IN THE FAMILY

A decision to separate is one of the hardest choices you may ever make, and it has consequences for everyone in your family. Both you and your children may feel confused about what is happening, and be unsettled about the impact of such change.

Separation can evoke strong feelings for everyone—you, your partner, your children, and even extended family members like grandparents, aunts and uncles. Your family is undergoing significant change—separation usually means that the family is dividing, and that one parent will be leaving the household.

With change comes emotion. You may feel sad or lonely, angry, guilty, or like you have failed in some way. Many parents have experiences of depression and anxiety. In fact, you may feel all these emotions at different times.

It is important to remember that your child also has strong feelings. They may feel grief, shock, insecurity and worry whether the remaining parent will leave them as well. Some may feel that they are to blame for the situation, while others may feel angry.

As a parent it's important to understand that your children are also going through a distressing time, and to do what you can to reduce the impact on them. Here are some basic tips to assist with that:

- ⇒ Prepare children as best you can. Give them a simple explanation of why you are separating
- $\Rightarrow$  Let your children know that both parents love them very much.
- ⇒ Remind children that it is not their fault—it is a decision that you as parents are making about your relationship.
- ⇒ Focus on the positives. Give lots of love and attention. Try to avoid conflict in front of your children's environment and routine.
- $\Rightarrow$  Acknowledge how your children are feeling, and that these feelings are okay.
