......I have posted home to year 7 & 9 parents a letter outlining Macksville High School teachers' unanimous decision to support the Australian Education Union moratorium and not deliver NAPLAN testing...... It's all happening at school with construction work in full swing. We have the Language Centre built to lock up stage with a covered walkway next to be built. Painters are working around the school repainting seats, classrooms and doors. There is a new front and electronic entrance sign going in, carpeting of several rooms along with a solid wall being constructed between B3 & 4.

At the moment the administration block is surrounded by building fencing in readiness for construction of scaffolding to allow workers to install a new iron roof. The school is looking more like a construction zone each day. The students need to be commended with all the builders reporting nothing but cooperation from our kids. Staff are doing it hard at times with a consistent chorus of jackhammer noise during lessons. The end result will be outstanding and we all look forward to the end of work and the improvements that will result.

I have posted home to year 7 & 9 parents a letter outlining Macksville High School teachers' unanimous decision to support the Australian Education Union moratorium and not deliver NAPLAN testing.

However a compromise has now been be reached and NAPLAN will now go ahead on Tuesday 11 Wednesday 12 and Thursday 13 May 2010. The valuable data that will be available to us about our students can assist our teaching to improve students' achievements.

The data obtained from NAPLAN was never intended to be used to rank schools and serves no positive purpose in helping parents know more about their child's school. A letter has been included with this newsletter with more information for you.

NAPLAN Testing Years 7 & 9 WILL GO AHEAD Tuesday Wednesday & Thursday 11 12 & 13 May 2010

The Teaching staff at Marksville High School is delighted to be able to lift the moratorium on the delivery of the NAPLAN tests.

This is a result of the Australian Education Union's (AEU) resolution to lift the moratorium following an offer by the Education Minister Julia Gillard to form a working party of educational experts, including representatives of the AEU, to provide advice on the use of student performance data and other indicators of school effectiveness. The AEU Federal President Angelo Gavrielatos has said: "The working party will provide a way forward to advance and address the profession's educational concerns relating to the misuse of student test data including school league tables."

I believe principals and teachers across NSW who stood their ground on this most important issue under what was at times extreme pressure should be congratulated on their commitment to what is in the best interest of our students for years to come.

The concern for our teachers has always been to try and ensure the data is not misused in ways that may be damaging to students and schools.

The teachers of Macksville High School appreciate the support and understanding offered by the parents/guardians of our students during the last few weeks.

Your child will receive a NAPLAN timetable to help with exam readiness and teachers will provide advice in class to assist students complete the test. Attendance is critical to ensure we obtain valuable information about your child's numeracy, literacy and personal growth rate.
