Welcome 2011 Year 7

Macksville High School (MHS) welcomed 112 students to Year 7 this year. At the Year 7 assembly held in the stadium, Principal, Paul Holding and Deputy Principal, Graeme Goodman, welcomed students and spoke to them about what they could look forward to over the next six years at high school. They spoke about how to take advantage of all that MHS has to offer, to respect and care for each other and to get involved in the new opportunities that will come their way. Many Year 7 students have come from small primary schools in the Valley so the size of their new year may have seemed daunting but it was nothing compared to the first major assembly with the entire student population of nearly 650.

There was a lot to remember with new class names and roll call groups but students settled in well changing classrooms every lesson and finding their way around the school. Teachers will monitor the student's progress over the coming weeks and changes can be made to classes if required to better suit each individual.

Students can look forward to excursions coming up in the year where they will have an opportunity to participate in a variety of sporting activities and spend time getting to know each other away from the classroom.

From The Principal

It's been a very busy and hot return to school this week. Year 7 have hit the ground running with many comments by teachers about how excited and cooperative they have been in class. We have a number of new enrolments in all years who have been made welcome and are beginning to feel at ease in their new school environment.

I was very proud of our achievements at the completion of the 2010 school year with our first evening presentation night for many years an outstanding success. Our HSC students did well. There were 5 students with ATARS in the 90's, many students receiving results that pleased them, their parents and their teachers. This week we have been hearing about students organising accommodation for university, exciting job prospects and plans for TAFE.

It was great to see the entire school at the assembly on Tuesday with the students looking great in their school uniforms. This year we have more closely linked uniform to our merit system with students who do not comply with our uniform wearing policy losing the privilege to receive Diamond Level, attend extra curricula activities such as representing the school, attending socials and formals. Parents support for wearing uniform is very much appreciated. The revised Welfare/Discipline Policy will be issued to the students and can be viewed on our school web site.

We have a number of new permanent staff this year and temporary teachers. I will be asking them to attend the first P&C meeting to meet parents and I encourage you to make contact with them if your son or daughter is taught by them. This year we have had a reduction in Deputy Principal positions with Graeme Goodman the only DP managing all years.

Yr 10 Work Experience

The first opportunity for Yr 10 students to do some Work Experience will be from April 4 to April 8 (leading up to Easter).

Students will receive paperwork and preparation early in the term and they will need to organise themselves quickly to get it back by the due date of Friday March 11. Please make sure you read all the material... but please encourage your student to make their own contact.

Over the years local employers have been very generous and supportive of our junior students. However, the resources of many employers have been stretched by the many requests for placements from senior school students and a wide range of community groups like TAFE, Universities, employment support agencies and other training providers. Some employers have chosen to focus on one sector and others have requested that applications come through the Careers Advisers rather than direct contact.

At the Nambucca valley Australia Day Ceremony, I was very proud to see John Rowe and our 15 years Girls' Rugby Union Team receive sports' awards. Thanks to Scott Stacey for the work he does each year with our nominations.

Over the holidays we had vandalism in the school that included windows broken, doors damaged and all of the air-conditioners on the roof of B and C block damaged. This has resulted in many thousands of dollars in repair bills and very uncomfortable conditions in class for our students and teachers at this time of year while repairs are being organised. The National Partnerships Literacy Program has seen students throughout the year work really hard to improve their skills. They were rewarded with an end of year party and sausage sizzle.

Comprising Year 8 students, the program enables improved learning skills in reading, writing, spelling and comprehension. Classes are held once a fortnight with intensive lessons in areas that students have been identified as showing a weakness. Those who participated stayed motivated and focused. In its first year a marked improvement particularly in spelling and punctuation was seen.

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QUICKSMART AND THE LITERACY ENRICHMENT PROGRAM

In 2010 some Year 8 students were identified through a detailed analysis of NAPLAN data, as students who would benefit from attending the numeracy program, Quicksmart, and the literacy enrichment program.

The students who participated in 2010 have shown great improvement in their numeracy and literacy skills at all levels. We are pleased to let you know that these successful programs will continue in 2011, however, there will be fewer students involved this year.
