YR 7 YARRAHAPINNI REPORT

The Year 7 students had a wonderful two davs exploring the Youth Centre at Yarrahapinni on Thursday 31st March and Friday 1st April.

The activities included Sand Modelling on the beach, Bush Walking and identifying unnatural phenomena within the environment, Waterslides and the Flying Fox. "Getting To Know You" sessions enabled students to learn more about _ each other. The "Senior Challenge Obstacle Course" included balancing on wires, logs and wooden platforms, traversing over murky lagoons on suspension bridges made of wires and rope, crawling under barbed wire through the mud, climbing a suspension ladder and through a tyre as well as a rock climbing wall.

Despite a heavy downfall of rain and some hail on the Thursday, the enthusiasm and excitement remained evident on everyone's faces. Mark Werner did a great job explaining how the tides and rips affect swimmers at the beach. He - discussed the natural erosion along the sand dunes and the types of wildlife found in and along the beachfront. "To be a Scientist"

Dr Cathy Foley, Scientist and Chief at CSIRO of Materials Science and Engineering Division visited Macksville High School (MHS) to talk to students about her personal journey to becoming a scientist and the exciting opportunities that a career in this industry can bring.

Students came from Bellingen, Bowraville and Nambucca Heads High Schools to hear the presentation where Dr Foley spoke about her story in becoming one of the country's leading scientists. Initially intending to be a science teacher she soon discovered this wasn't her passion and that she really wanted to be an experimental scientist. Whilst completing her PhD at Macquarie University her thesis was on indium nitride thin films; this research led to the production of what is called white LED's (the really bright light you can now get in torches). 23 years ago not many people had worked in this area and at a recent conference Dr Foley was introduced as the mother of indium nitride.

Dr Foley also spoke about some of the ground breaking research she has been involved in including, superconductors and magnets, where the magnet floats on top of a superconductor which enabled the invention of high speed trains as seen in Tokyo that can travel at 600 kilometres per hour. Biomagnetism that can look at magnetic fields that come from the heart and brain, advances in mineral exploration and work with the Department of Defence to look for submarines deep in the ocean.

The students were very engaged and learnt about the variety of different areas they could work in and the exciting opportunities available to scientists. The chance to do fabulous research, conduct experiments and travel the world. These types of visits enable our students to be exposed to experiences and people who can open a new world of opportunities for their future career choices. MHS would like to take this opportunity to thank Dr Foley for her visit and it has opened many eyes to the possibilities out there.

Mosquito-borne Diseases: Information for School Communities

Dear Principal

I am writing to seek your assistance in alerting your school community about a range of health risks associated with mosquito bites. Recent heavy rainfall and flooding in NSW has led to high numbers of mosquitoes in some parts of the state.

Mosquitoes can transmit a number of viral infections including Ross River virus and Barmah Forest virus and there have been large numbers of these infections reported so far in 2011. More recently, a rarer but more serious mosquito-borne infection called Murray Valley Encephalitis (MVE) has been detected in western NSW.

It is likely that the risk period may extend through until Easter.

I seek your assistance in promoting awareness about the prevention of mosquito bites among school students who live in western NSW and for any school groups planning to travel west of the Great Dividing Range on school camps or excursions.

Mosquitoes are most active around dusk and in the first few hours of the evening and again at dawn. Rivers, creeks, wetlands and recently-flooded land allows mosquitoes to breed and so people living near or visiting these areas need to be especially careful to prevent mosquito bites.

RECOMMENDED WAYS TO PREVENT MOSQUITO BITES

* Cover up when outside and mosquitoes are active (especially around dawn and around dusk). Wear light-coloured, loose-fitting long pants and sleeves and covered footwear.

* Use an effective personal insect repellent on all exposed skin. The best mosquito repellents contain Diethyl Toluamide (DEET) or Picaridin.

* Re-apply personal insect repellent according to directions as protection wears off. The stronger the concentration of an insect repellent, the less frequently it will need to be applied to stop mosquito bites. Repellents containing low concentrations of DEET or Picaridin provide shorter periods of protection and need to be reapplied more frequently.

* Mosquito coils or plug-in vapourising mats are effective when used indoors. Devices that use light to attract and electrocute insects are not effective.

- * Ensure houses are fitted with flyscreens on the doors and windows to prevent entry of mosquitoes.
- * When camping, use flyscreens on caravans and tents or sleep under mosquito nets.
