Funded under the Commonwealth Government's TTC in Schools Program to provide industry standard training facilities, Construction and Metal & Engineering students have been road testing the new equipment and using a range of new tools provided as part of the upgrade.

Although the "official opening"

is yet to take place, a breakfast invitation was extended to local trades employers who had supported the School's Application for the establishment of the facility.

Local builders toured the new Construction, Metal & Engineering and Automotive facilities and were impressed by the equipment and work areas which students now have access to.

Mr Paul Holding together with Construction Teachers, Greg Hill and Grant Gough thanked employers for their attendance and acknowledged the valuable partnership between Macksville High School and local businesses,

who provide work placements and work experience for students at the school.

Youth Directions – who currently coordinate structured workplace learning for students in Year 11 & 12 Construction Pathway courses work in conjunction with the school and Department of Education & Communities to promote Trade Training Centres to industry, as well as School Based Apprenticeship & Traineeships linked to Trade Training Centres.

THAT'S GOLD!

Talented all-rounders grab gold at the NSW Combined High Schools (CHS) Athletics Championships held at Sydney Olympic Park Athletics Centre last week.

Ten Macksville High School students attended the three day state carnival held from September 8-10 achieving some terrific results. It has been another busy year for one of the Valley's most talented teenagers, 14 year old Alina Tape. She was competing in her third CHS carnival this year and was in sensational form. Alina dominated in her events, taking home the gold in both the 800m in a time of 2:18.57 and the 400m in a time of 59:32.

18 year old John Rowe spent Tuesday and Wednesday playing Netball for the school at the CHS Netball championships before heading to Athletics on Thursday. John gained a silver medal in the Long Jump with a jump of 6.52m only 2 cm

behind the winner. Then he went on to compete in the challenging five event Pentathlon, bettering last year's silver medal effort and taking home the gold this year. In his last event, the Triple Jump, John finished in 6th place.

Multi-talented, 15 year old Beau Tape also came straight from CHS Netball to the Athletics competition. Beau is no stranger to this level of competition and has competed for the North Coast many times before. Beau's decision to tackle the Open 2000m Steeplechase proved to be a good one and he was rewarded with the Bronze medal after completing the event in a time of 6:56.36, only beaten by boys from the 17 years age group. Beau also secured a top ten finish in the 16 years 400m and was placed 13th overall in the 16 year

boys 800m. Macksville High newcomer, 15 year old Yierah Dunn also had a busy schedule at the carnival, competing in the 100m, 200m, Long Jump and Javelin AWD events. Yierah had a great carnival and was just outside the medals in all of her events finishing fourth in Javelin, and fifth in the 100m, 200m and Long Jump.

Jordan Sheather again demonstrated his raw talent for the Shot Put event finishing in 8th place in the 16 years event. It was also an opportunity for Jordan to catch up with ex-Macksville High School student, Ben Fitzgerald. Ben moved to Hunter Sports High to develop his Athletic talent after being identified by Coach Ken Harradine at a training camp run by Richie Donovan. Ben took out the gold medal in the Shot Put and Discus and gained the bronze medal in the Javelin.

Showing great sportsmanship Jordan also was quick to step in and help out the 17+ boys relay team when they ended up one short. He joined Andrew Flarrety, Beau Tape and John Rowe and the team finished in 17th place in a time of 51.50.

Other great performances at the carnival included; Harry Mitchell finishing 12th in the 14 year boys High Jump and Lawrence Vernon finishing 12th in the 13 year boys Javelin. Well done also to Alec Gage who competed in the 12 year boys Discus and Alyssa Cotterell in the 17+ girls High Jump.

Thanks also to Richie Donovan, Trevor Keast, Nambucca Valley and Stuarts Point Little Athletics Clubs for their contributions in assisting our athletes in their preparation for competition. Congratulations to all of the Macksville High School students who proudly represented our school and community.

The girls' team were also very green when it came to competition basketball; however their enthusiasm levels were off the scale.

Defensively they were as solid as any team in the competition, and this became evident in the first game they played against Westport, where the girls kept them scoreless for most of the match and eventually ran out easy winners.

The second game saw them take on Port Macquarie who were also competition favourites, boasting several representative players, one of whom had to be at least 190cm tall. At no time were our girls intimidated by their opposition, and the game had been going for quite some time before the first points were scored. This only happened when one of their rep players showed her experience and drew the foul by driving the fast lane. In fact all their points in the first quarter came from the free throw line. This proved to be their tactic and the referee was quite obliging. In the end our girls were basically fouled out of the game.

In conclusion it was a very successful day and all players should feel very proud of themselves, as were both the coaches. Special thanks go out to the parents for their help transporting players to the event, without them, occasions like this would not happen.
