Each Wednesday afternoon a small group of girls have been learning the art of playing carpet bowls at the Macksville RSL. We are very greatful to the club for allowing the girls to utilise their facilities. They have been improving their techniques and styles every visit. This week the girls watched "Crackerjack", an Australian comedy about a group of lawn bowlers who work hard to save their bowling club after it suffers huge financial hardship. We celebrated Harmony Day and reflected on Senior Citizens Week.





### **Child Studies 1 - Update**

The Year 9 & 10 girls studying Child Studies 1 this year have begun their course by exploring the "changing family". They are aware of the many different types of family structures commonplace in today's societies. From the nuclear family, to communal living, blended families, step families, gay couples, extended families with grandparents living with their children and grandchildren, those with adopted children, single parent families, and families without children to name a few. They read about the functions of each family. Providing shelter, food, clothing, moral guidance, economic support, love and care as well as positive role models were a few issues covered. They have learned about contraception and conception. Recently we invited Libby Knight, a representative from the Women's Health Centre, to discuss the pros and cons of using a variety of contraceptive devices. She talked about sexually transmitted diseases as well as issues related to pregnancy. The girls found the session most interesting and informative.

Following on from these lessons the girls have produced information pamphlets related to many conditions which have an impact on unborn babies and their mums. Some of the topics include ultrasounds, ectopic pregnancies, twins or multiple births, Down syndrome, gestational diabetes and amniocentesis. The girls had to research their topic, and using their own words they had to generate a brochure using a computer, that included illustrations and explained the most important facts including any risks, side effects and other implications.

Soon they will explore the "stages of labour" that an expectant mother goes through prior to delivery. This will culminate in a visit to the Maternity unit in Macksville where a midwife will talk to them about the support and services provided by the hospital staff.
