As a school we are immensely proud of her and cant wait to see how far this young champion will go in her chosen sport.









Year 10 Work Experience 2013

The first opportunity for Year 10 students to do some Work Experience will be from April 8 to April 12 (last week of Term 1).

Students will receive paperwork and preparation early in the term and they will need to organize themselves quickly to get it back by the due date of Friday, March 15. Please make sure you read all the material... but please encourage your student to make their own contact.

Over the years local employers have been very generous and supportive of our junior students. However, the resources of many employers have been stretched by the many requests for placements from senior school students and a wide range of community groups like TAFE, Universities, employment support agencies and other training providers. Some employers have chosen to focus on one sector and others have requested that applications come through the Careers Advisers rather than direct contact.

There will be separate meetings for students wishing to go to local Veterinary practices, and the Hospitals. There is additional paperwork and protocols involved. Students should not return to their old primary school.

Work experience should have a vocational aim. That is it's about tasting a job, or having something relevant on a resume.

2013 ICAS Exam



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2013 INTERNATIONAL COMPETITIONS AND ASSESSMENTS FOR SCHOOLS (ICAS)

Dear Parent

Welcome to the 2013 International Competitions and Assessments for Schools (ICAS). For over 30 years, ICAS has taken place annually in schools throughout Australia, New Zealand, Singapore, Malaysia, Brunei, the Pacific region and South Africa. Your child is invited to participate in ICAS in 2013.

ICAS provides an opportunity for all students in Years 3 to 12 to gain a measure of their own achievement in an external testing situation. It provides teachers, parents and students with comprehensive reporting of results in the areas of Computer Skills, English, Mathematics, Science, Spelling and Writing.

All students receive a certificate and an individual student report indicating which questions they answered correctly and their score compared with the rest of the students tested. The tests are an excellent preparation for national tests and the student report is useful for highlighting your child's strengths and weaknesses. The certificate and individual student report are also suitable for your child to include in a portfolio.

Certificates are awarded for each year level as follows:

- High Distinction to the top 1% of entrants
- Distinction to the next 10% of entrants
- Credit to the next 25% of entrants
- Participation to all other participating students.

A UNSW medal is awarded when the highest score in each year level in each state in each subject is judged to be sufficiently meritorious. These medals are presented at either a UNSW Medal Ceremony or at a school assembly. Students must sit on the official sitting dates to be eligible for a UNSW medal.

The entry fee per student is as follows:

- Computer Skills 21 May 2013 (\$8.00) (Years 7-10)
- Science 5 June 2013 (\$8.00) (Years 7-12)
- Writing 17 June 2013 to 21 June 2013 (\$17.00) (Years 7-12)
- Spelling 18 June 2013 (\$11.00) (Year 7 only)
- English 31 July 2013 (\$8.00) (Years 7-12)
- Mathematics 13 August 2013 (\$8.00) (Years 7-12)

2012 Year 12 Major Wood Work Project

My project is called a rotating vanity cabinet. I decided to make it so that I could own a beautiful and unique piece of furniture to use to store all my 'girly' objects, from jewellery to bags, to make up and shoes. My project is made up of two separate cabinets, the base is made of flooded gum with a decorative red cedar top and red cedar doors that meet at an 'S' bend. Inside is a shelf used for storing larger objects. The top cabinet is oval in shape and made entirely of red cedar with the exception of a piece of bloodwood used in the swivel. The front of the cabinet features 'S' bend doors that match the doors of the base cabinet. Inside these doors is a black felted interior with red cedar shelves as well as small gold hooks used for hanging jewellery. This cabinet is designed for containing smaller and more precious items. The back of the cabinet supports a mirrored face with a decorative material edging, this mirror is accessed by turning the cabinet on the built in swivel. This large mirror combined with the two smaller mirrors in the base cabinet doors provides an almost complete full length mirror. This mirror combined with the specialised storage space makes my project the ideal cabinet for any woman with even just a touch of vanity.

The most difficult part of the creation process was getting my head around the idea of creating the oval. I spent every Wednesday I had free working in the woodwork rooms as well as every free period I had. I had to create three oval rings out of angles which I am usually terrible at, but by checking and re-checking constantly I eventually managed. The only time I ever felt as though I'd hit a wall with my project was the day the bobbin sander snapped out a large section of my oval cabinet frame. I was speechless, but with the help of my teacher the frame was easily fixed and now there are only faint cracks remaining. Working on this project as well as another major work plus all my other classes was difficult, I feel like I spent more time in the woodwork rooms than all my other classrooms

put together but at the end of the day I know it was all worth it. I didn't build my cabinet to get high HSC marks, I built it for myself, that and to show up all the boys in my woodwork class of course. We all made amazing pieces of furniture though and I enjoyed working with my teacher and class mates, Industrial Technology was definitely the highlight of my senior school years. It gave me many new skills which I used to create my vanity cabinet, which has been nominated for consideration into InTech (Industrial Technology), the annual showcase of exemplary works to be displayed at the Powerhouse Museum and then to travel to all regional centres. I was over joyed when I received the letter about it, and whether my cabinet is chosen to be displayed or not the consideration is an enormous achievement for me. I am so proud of what I created and can agree with what my teacher would always joke, "not bad for a Macksville girl."
