From our Principal

On Thursday this week we had the opportunity to farewell our Year 12 students at their Graduation Assembly with over 150 parents and family members present. Students took the opportunity to reflect on the great times they have had at school, acknowledged the people that contributed to their success and to say farewell to many of their school friends. It is always my hope that Year 12 looks back without regrets, that they make lifelong friends and leave us with the capacity to take opportunities as they present themselves during their working life.

From our 72 graduating students, Mrs Shrubb has assisted 39 students apply for 52 early entry positions and a range of scholarship applications. A number of students have also been offered full time employment on the strength of their excellent report and school references.

We as a school and community have been working to support an increase in the number of our aboriginal students to graduate from Macksville High School with a HSC. This year I am proud to tell you that 8 of our students graduating are aboriginal and through the Charles Sturt University Darrambal program five of these students have been shortlisted for a variety of positions in aboriginal health.

I also took the opportunity to thank our 2013 School Captains, Courtney Beaumont and Douglas Robertson and Vice Captains Kylie Ellis and Anthony Thompson. Their commitment and leadership has been outstanding. Thank you, also to our parents for their trust and partnership and teachers for the commitment to their students.

The boys in this team come from all corners of the State and gained selection in June this year through a series of trial games held at The Armidale School. This final game follows one played in Newcastle against Api Fo'ou College from Tonga; unfortunately Jordan had to miss this one because he was in the middle of the HSC trials. The first game the team played was also held in the Hunter, in this game the boys trounced the highly favoured CHS team and meant that in the carnival held at The Kings School last holidays, Country XV were placed further up the ladder than expected, something their coaches were very proud of.

This series follows the great year Jordan has had in Rugby Union, having played with Chris Buckley for the North Coast schools team; he had also represented Mid-North Coast at State carnival held in Wyong. All this followed a successful tour of Fiji and Samoa with the NSW Development Squad, which also included Damien Carriage, in the first school holidays this year. On this tour Jordan was named 'Man of the Match' in the first game against Fiji; I think this was to make up for missing the second game against Samoa with a stomach bug from drinking the water.

Rugby Union at Macksville has presented Jordan with many

invaluable opportunities. The coaching, support and camaraderie has been second to none and is directly attributable to Mick Baines and Josh Webb and all the time, energy and experience they share so willingly with the students. Jordan is hoping to continue with his Rugby next year playing for Albies in Armidale.

Macksville High finished runner up in the Lower North Coast U16's Futsal Championships held yesterday in Port Maquarie. After a bye in Round 1, we were scheduled to played Wauchope in Round 2. From the first whistle, the team looked very rusty, but once the boy's found their touch, we started to dominate the game. We led by 2 at the half and were kept in the game by some superb saves from Keeper Jamie Bekis. We were pushed all the way for a hard fought 8-7 win. Harry Mitchell, Sam Armes and Jye Allen all impressed. This result moved us into the final against Camden Haven.

The final began with a bang, Trent Stack scored 15 seconds into the game and set the tone for the first 20 minute half. An inspiring performance from the team including goals from Trent, Jacob Simpson and Wesley Styles put us up 5-1 at the break.

Bubbling with confidence, the boys started with the same intensity, unfortunately tired
