RUGBY REPORT

Friday the 5th of September saw Mick Baines (work experience coach standing in for Ms Dempsey) and the intrepid Ian Smith tootle off to Port Macquarie for the Under 14 Coast to Country Cup Rugby Union competition. With 6 teams entering the day was organised into 2 pools with Macksville playing Kempsey and JPC and another pool comprising Wauchope, St Paul's and St Joseph's regional. An early start saw us arrive at a cold and blustery Stuart Park for the kickoff at 10 am. With many of the boys playing their first ever games of 15 a side rugby and many others making their debut the day was always going to be a surprise packet. The first game was against a physically imposing Kempsey side but it was the Macksville boys who played a brand of technically proficient running rugby that saw them victorious. Captains Michael Baldock and Mitchell Morison Kings were superb at the breakdown and controlling the show respectively. The Swampies pack were working well as a unit with Dylan Leckie and Kaij Williams in everything and Jared Baldwin muscling up through the middle. Harvey Taitume showed his technical proficiency and rugby nous to impose himself in tight. Sam Price, Keedan Bale and Matt James rotated through the propping duties without missing a beat. Jarrah Godfrey Martin and Luke Ormandy were ever present, carting the ball up in attack again and again. Clay Saville continues to impress in Rugby working in tandem with Mitchell with some slick delivery and good vision. Centres Nash Hutchinson and Tobaskin Bonett made constant inroads with power running gaining the advantage line again and again. The back three of Nathan Sternbauer, Zeth Milgate and Jasper Valentine Boxsell also showed great potential and will become great



finishers as they progress. Nicholas Willer and Ryan Cotterell also showed great promise although Ryan was unfortunately injured near the end of the first game popping a miracle pass out the back to keep play alive. Macksville ran out sound victors and had started the day on fire. MACKSVILLE HIGH THE BACKBONE OF GOANNAS MAIDEN PREMIERSHIP

Up to 18 current and former Macksville High students and 3 current staff have provided the key to the Bowraville Goannas first competition premiership. This title took only to one year to achieve, but was several years in the making.

The highly talented side is filled with North Coast and NSW Country representatives from Macksville. These boys trained strongly throughout the year, and won the match 25-11 over a gallant Kempsey Cannonballs. In a match that was torrid and very tense, a 15 minute period of stoic second half defence laid the platform for the win.

The first half was scrappy, and played directly into Kempsey's hands. The turnovers and penalties came at will and the Goannas were playing themselves into defeat. Despite the mountain of possession against them, the Goannas scored two tries. Josh Bartlett scored beside the posts and Jye Perkins ran a great line from an excellent Peter Minisini pass to score late in the half to lead 10-6.

The half time rocket did not have the desired effect. More mistakes saw Kempsey sneak ahead 11-10 before the Goannas responded to lead 15-11. The next 15 minutes was all defence, as the Goannas repelled countless Kempsey attacks. The scrum improved considerably, and the Goannas finally retained the ball. After a rare penalty, another Goannas try increased the lead to 20-11 with 5 minutes to go.

As the Cannonballs tried valiantly to score, their desperation created mistakes. Keith Donovan seized on a loose kick, broke through the tiring defensive line before unloading to Jake Capell to score with the last play of the game, sparking celebrations not seen before in Goannas history.

There were also several awards after the match. Josh Bartlett capped a scintillating year with the best zone player award, and Max Hoysted was the highest point scorer for his support play and much improved goal kicking. Jye Perkins was voted player's player with an exceptional all round performance, and Luke O'Loughlin is relentless around the breakdown. However, and all players deserve enormous praise for their commitment to maintaining a positive approach to the season.
