NEW ABSENCE NOTIFICATION SYSTEM

Commencing 5TH May, we will be moving away from mailing out our 'yellow' absentee letters advising you of an unexplained absence for your student, to an SMS/email alert system.

This will mean that if your student is marked absent during rollcall and we have not received previous advice from you regarding this, you will be sent an SMS and/or an email on the morning of the absence advising you of their absence and requesting that you contact the school.

You will receive an SMS and an email if we have both of these recorded but you need only to reply to one or the other, not both. If your contact details need to be updated, please phone our office so that our records are correct.

There are various ways to reply to our notification of an absence (see below in preference order) and when the absence has been explained, we will record this in our system:

- SMS by replying to our text message when replying by text, it is very important that you hit the 'reply' button and not enter in the number directly as this number changes with every message and we will not receive your reply. It is not an actual school number but is linked to a server
- 2. Emailing to macksville-h.school@det.nsw.edu.au
- 3. Phoning the school office on 65681066

If the absence is correct, we need to have your reply within 7 days or the absence becomes 'unjustified' and then cannot be changed. This can have implications with Centrelink payments tied to school attendance. If you think an error has been made and your student should be at school, please make sure you contact us so we can follow this up.

It is very important that our students attend school and it is a legal requirement that absences are explained by parent/carers. We feel this new system of contacting you will assist with attendance by making it simple and easy for you to advise us as to why your student is absent and errors that may have occurred with roll marking will also be able to be corrected promptly.

Year 7 students and Year 9 students will complete NAPLAN examinations in Literacy and Numeracy on 13th and 14th May. Please remind your child it is compulsory to use a calculator in the Calculator section of the Numeracy exam. Calculators may be purchased from the front office for \$20. A rubber and spare 2H pencil could be useful. As Year 7 will be sitting their exams in the stadium, students are reminded to wear warm clothing and may bring a small rug if needed. Students will complete multiple choice sections in pencil. Should they make a mistake the wrong answer must be completely rubbed to maximise marks.

CAREERS



- 1. <u>Year 10 Workexperience</u>: all done and dusted now in the last week of last term...with many students reporting having had a fantastic time + a number having been offered employment and training possibilities following the time, around two thirds made the most of this amazing opportunity. I talked with all the employers, who uniformly reported that our students were showing interest and cooperation in their work places as well as courtesy and commitment!!
- 2. <u>Tax File Numbers</u>: most that want to, have applied and these are sent away. If you haven't heard back OR your child didn't get around to applying, please send them to see me so it can be chased up.
- 3. <u>Coffs Harbour Careers EXPO</u>: All Year 10 have been given permission notes (on Thursday 1^{st} May) for this EXPO- which is coming up on Thursday 15^{th} May; the notes need to be returned to the front office by **TUESDAY 13^{th} May** at the

latest please. The EXPO is to give our students a 'taste' of the sorts of training available when they finish schooling- and how they might be able to access it! i.e.: They shouldn't miss this time!! To help make it achievable, the coach cost is being subsidised so it will only cost them \$5- for the day...so no excuses!! On the day, short seminars will also be available in a range of specific interest areas- including health, Trades and Professional Services (surveying, architecture and engineering). Watch for the adverts on the TV leading up to this...

4. <u>Year 12 Happenings</u>: Last Friday (2nd May) was the UNE Open day- where some of our students joined the coach to access this time and learn about university study, courses and entry requirements, college living and technology required for university study!! Coming up on the 19th May is a talk with staff from ACPE (Australian College of Physical Education) which is a non-university provider of tertiary training. Further away on 23rd July is the Coffs Harbour Post School Options EXPO at CHEC- which is a mix of trade, professional and university providers available for Year 12, to give them some inspiration just as their last months of schooling are winding up.

SENIOR VISUAL ARTS

Last week a group of senior Visual Arts students travelled to Sydney for the annual gallery excursion. We spent two days visiting a number of different types of art galleries and viewed many different types of art forms including the traditional (painting/drawing) to the contemporary such as installations and video art. At the Art Gallery of New South Wales we spent time admiring and being inspired by the works created by last year's HSC students in ArtExpress. Our visit at the Museum of Contemporary Art involved a workshop focusing on creating a Senior Body of Work and a guided tour of the Sydney Biennale exhibit. In the afternoon we took the ferry across to Cockatoo Island to view more Biennale works. On Thursday there were a number of highlights which included an amazing guided tour by our lovely tour guides at the Asian specific White Rabbit Gallery, during dinner at The Star some students met some musicians from the group 3rd Degree (made known on last year's X factor) and we finished off the night watching the amazing musical Strictly Ballroom. From all reports the students enjoyed themselves although there was tons of walking! Thanks to Mrs Toni Jones for her help as well as Mrs Erica Lyne for her support as well.





EVOLVING INTO LADIES SCHEME (EILS)


Last term Macksville High began a girls' program to align with the current Transition Into Manhood Scheme (TIMS) boys program. The program is consistent with the guidelines of TIMS which follows Covey's 'Seven Habits of Highly Effective People'. The primary objective of the scheme is to develop our Year 7 and 8 girls into proactive people who can function in accordance with society and therefore evolve into healthy, successful people. Our program explores topics such as teamwork, making choices, goal setting, personal hygiene, nutrition, sexual health and stress management. Physical and recreational activities are linked in to each habit and topic and include self-defence, yoga, traditional art, cooking, surfing and canoeing.

The girls experienced their first self-defence lesson in Week 10 of last term when Adam Rumsey introduced the girls to simple defensive techniques. Students were required to work in pairs for most activities, many of the girls a tad nervous from watching the boys do mixed martial arts the week before. By the end of the session, we were pleased that all the girls had a go and were more relaxed as they figured out we weren't doing quite the same activities as the boys. We intend to get Adam back this term for a follow up lesson and we are looking forward to it very much!

As we are all aware, Term 2 is quite a short term, with a public holiday that only leaves 3 available Mondays for EILS this term. It's proved a slow start but we anticipate that Terms 3 and 4 will provide for a little more consistency, which is what we need to achieve the objectives of the program.
