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

It was my great privilege to be invited along to the North Coast TAFE awards recently as a guest of Year 12 student, Sandie Grant-McDonell. Sandie had been nominated by her TAFE teacher, Trudie McCaul for the award of SBAT/TVET Student of the year. Sandie is a School Based Trainee at Macksville Hospital where she is being trained in Human Services – Health Specialisation. What this all means in simple language is, that Sandie works as a paid employee at the hospital ten hours a week as part of her HSC. She is gaining the skills and knowledge to be an enrolled nurse, and benefitting by being able to include this as a HSC subject through her TAFE course. Sandie was nominated as she has been an outstanding student at TAFE, and is also receiving extraordinary praise for her work on the job at Macksville Hospital.

On the night, we were blown away by the prestige of the occasion, and the regard these awards are held in. The room was full of adults, and all but two award winners were adults. Sandie was speechless when she received the second last award of the night, and one of the two most prestigious awards given at the ceremony. The award recipients came from as far away as the Gold Coast, and all the way down to Taree.

Sandie is only the sixth recipient of this award, and the first in the Nambucca Valley. We are very proud of Sandie and what she has achieved during her traineeship. We currently have eleven SBAT's at Macksville High School and she is a wonderful role model and mentor to them. Sandie intends to commence university next year in nursing and we are confident she will continue to knock people's socks off with her amazing skills in her chosen field.

ONLINE CHAMPIONSHIP FOR LANGUAGE STUDENTS

Recently 153 students at Macksville High School participated in the Online World championship for language students. Our school came 3rd in NSW and all students are to be congratulated on contributing to the score of 74,000 correct answers to questions in Bahasa during the ten days. Every 500 questions answered correctly meant a student went from a credit level to the Bronze level.

The majority of our students achieved around 350 to 450 points, with some achieving 80 points in 50 minutes

WHAT IS A MHS SBAT

You may have heard that Macksville High now has twelve SBAT's in our senior years. An SBAT or school based trainee is a student that combines their HSC with a paid work placement for about ten hours a week, at a variety of occupations within the valley. The student also completes a VET course (vocational education) in conjunction with that traineeship. Sometimes this happens at school, and sometimes it occurs at TAFE in either Macksville or Coffs Harbour.

The current MHS SBAT's are:- Mikaela Bartlett – teacher trainee Macksville Public School, Dylan Crumpton – civil construction with Lend Lease, Hayden De Jonge –primary industries with Peter Townley Dairy, Bailey Farr – civil construction with Lend Lease, Sandie Grant- McDonell – health specialisation at Macksville Hospital, Maddi Mason – business services at Mitre 10, Harry Mitchell – hospitality at Nambucca Valley Care, Kate Shaw – health specialisation at Macksville Hospital, Inekia Small – teacher trainee at Scotts Head Public School, Cameron Southan – autoelectrician at Mid Coast Trucks, Shenae Stweart – business services at National Australia Bank, Jaiden Walker – teacher trainee at Bowraville Central School.

Naplan 2014

It was a pleasure to supervise the Year 7 students who completed the 2014 NAPLAN exams in May. For many of the students this was the first time they had assembled in a large group to complete exams in a formal setting in the stadium. Students experienced reading, writing, language and numeracy exams. The cohort is to be congratulated in the mature way they approached the exams, following instructions and completing all papers to the best of their ability. They are a credit to themselves, their parents and the school. Well done Year Seven.

Year Nine completed their NAPLAN exams in classrooms. Staff reported a positive approach to their exams and congratulations are also in order

AUSTRALIAN MARITIME COLLEGE VISIT

A representative from the Australian Maritime College in Tasmania visited maths classes at Macksville High School recently to enlighten senior students about how maths is used in the maritime environment. We examined the critical factors in designing high speed patrol boats by interpreting scatter diagrams. The Hydrostatics of a boat (whether it will float or capsize) can be calculated using the formula

$$Y = \frac{B}{2} \left(1 - \frac{4}{L^2} x^2 \right) \left(1 - \frac{z^2}{D^2} \right) \left(1 + \frac{0.8 x^2}{L^2} \right) + \frac{Bz^2}{2D^2} \left(1 - \frac{z^8}{D^8} \right) \left(1 - \frac{4x^2}{L^2} \right)^4$$

where L represents the length of the hull, B the beam length and D the draft of the hull. By substituting values into the equation it can then be graphed to show the shape of the hull.

We undertook a feasibility study looking at the costs and benefits of locating a wind farm off the east coast of Tasmania by looking at such statistics as average wind strength, how efficient a turbine would be and how much power would be produced by the wind farm. Financial, environmental, sustainability, health factors, (seasickness) and the practicality of locating wind farms off shore were all taken into account.

We looked at the effect of a 'following sea" (where waves travel in the same direction as the vessel) on the velocity of a boat, and also about how scale models can show how a finished design will work.

(A model ship might cost \$ 3000 to build and \$ 10 000 to test, while a full size ship can cost millions of dollars.)



The visit opened student's eyes regarding careers in Maritime Engineering and was greatly appreciated by students.

*UNE MATHEMATICS COMPETITION



Ms Cooper and Ms Revell from the maths staff at Macksville High are to be congratulated on organising two teams from 8M1 maths class to travel to Armidale to participate in the annual University of New England Gifted and Talented Mathematics Competition.

At 5a.m. students met Ms Revell and Mrs Keeys at Caltex and joined with Bowraville Central and Nambucca Heads High School in a bus trip to Armidale (Thanks Mr Joyce; great driver!) After a look around the university grounds the group assembled for the day's event.

Teams of four students participate in problem solving activities which emphasise cooperative learning and teamwork. In one activity, the teams can choose to solve simple 1 mark problems or more complex problems, which, if solved correctly, can earn the team 3 points. What a dilemma! What strategy shall we use? Lots of easy questions? (And low point score). Or take the risk and try harder challenges. If a challenge was too hard, they can return the problem and exchange it for an easier problem. They cannot get help from their teacher as each teacher is assigned to a school different from their own. The teams rotated about the hall so played against many different schools.

Some schools were amazingly awesome but others we held our own against.

Macksville representatives were Tobaskin Bonet, Sam Kinnear, Daisy Peachman, Chloe Northfield, Mickayla Ennis, Alex George, Gabriel Farr and Samuel Price.

The students acquitted themselves well, looked great in the school blazer and tie and were a credit to MHS.
