HSC Science students recently travelled to Sydney with Mrs Conway and Mrs Hughes where a series of activities in Biology, Chemistry and Physics were carried out. At the University of NSW Biology students examined specimens of cancerous lungs, gangrenous feet, other diseased body parts and unborn babies as part of a workshop for the topic *The Search for Better Health*.

Meanwhile Physics students were at the Powerhouse Museum conducting experiments in electricity, motion and electromagnetism.

Chemistry students toured the submarine HMAS Onslow and the Naval Warship HMAS Vampire at Darling Harbour before attending a lengthy workshop and tour of the Australian National Maritime Museum. These were valuable experiences for the Chemistry topic *Shipwrecks, Corrosion and*

Conservation. Students also visited Australia's oldest scientific research institution, the Australian Museum. At the University of Newcastle, 3 hour laboratory workshops were held in Biology, Chemistry and Physics. Students from Hunter region schools also participated. They carried out experimental procedures and used scientific instrumentation that is not available in schools.

The experiments were fun, challenging and excellent preparation for their HSC.

UNE MATHEMATICS COMPETITION

Ms Cooper and Ms Revell from the maths staff at Macksville High are to be congratulated on organising two teams from 8M1 maths class to travel to Armidale to



participate in the annual University of New England Gifted and Talented Mathematics Competition.

At 5 am students met Ms Revell and Mrs Keeys at Caltex and joined with Bowraville Central and Nambucca Heads High School in a bus trip to Armidale (Thanks Mr Joyce; great driver!) After a look around the university grounds the group assembled for the day's event.

Teams of four students participated in problem solving activities which emphasise cooperative learning and teamwork. In one activity, the teams can choose to solve simple 1 mark problems or more complex problems, which, if solved correctly, can earn the team 3 points. What a dilemma! What strategy shall we use? Lots of easy questions? (And low point score). Or take the risk and try harder challenges. If a challenge was too hard, they can return the problem and exchange it for an easier problem. They cannot get help from their teacher as each teacher is assigned to a school different from their own. The teams rotated about the hall so played against many different schools.



Some schools were amazingly awesome but others we held our own against.

Students have a deadline for dates involved in both of above and should be encouraged to check their DEC email addresses to be familiar with these! ie. University of Wollongong Early Entry online applications close on 29.08.14... Students must complete <u>all their early Entry/School recommended entry</u> <u>applications by Friday 05.09.14</u> (either online or to the careers office)- a non-negotiable date!!

2. <u>ASPIRE Institute</u>: are sited in Manly (Sydney) and offer an alternative entry pathway to a range of universities (UTS, UOW, UON, ECU, UWS, etc..); their 1 year training offer Diploma Level credentialing, which guarantees a pathway into 2nd year of a bachelor degree at a linked university.
