In week 3 of term 4, the Macksville high cattle team took part in the Lismore North Coast National Show, which was a 4 day cattle show.

The first day was Wednesday 21st of October. We all left Macksville High School at 8:30am on Wednesday morning and arrived at Lismore Showgrounds around lunch time. Once there we unloaded the 3 steers we had showing, set up the stalls and setup our camping spot area at the show ground.

Later that afternoon, Katie and Elouise headed into town with Mr Argent and Tony to get supplies for the 4 days of our stay. On Thursday 22nd, we had a busy day starting at 5:30 am. Elouise Ennis, Megan Williams and Katie Cooper did the morning shift where they had to bring the steers out, give them water and clean them up to be washed. Tylor Ballard Angus Johnson, David Styles and John Panaguiton all came over at 7:30 to watch the cattle. At 9:00 there was a Youth Education seminar where 4 different speakers from the Generation AG Society spoke to us about the Agricultural industry giving us tips on cattle judging, public speaking and preparing steers for parading. After the youth talk, we collected the steers to weigh them. Tylor, JD, David, Angus, Wesley Styles and Mark then washed the steers. Meanwhile, Elouise cleaned the beds up where the cattle were laying for the night. Katie and Megan blow-dried the steers and prepped them to be shown. Wezz, Katie and Megan then went to get dressed up to lead them in their classes. During the classes, a huge storm brewed up over Lismore causing the official to delay the rest of the classes until the storm passed. Later on that night the steers were auctioned off to butchers.

Friday 23rd was a pretty easy going day as we had no events on, but later on that night, a Young Farmers Challenge was held. There were at least 20 other competitors. The group from our school were BOOFHEADS UNITED and was made up of Tylor, Mark, Josh and Sarah. Sarah was from McCarthy High School. Another was TERRY'S TERRORS which had Wezz, Angus, JD and David in it and the last group was called TERRY'S GALOOTS with Megan, Katie and Elouise.

The challenge was made up of a number of events. We had to run a hay bale to the other side of the arena, and then 3 people had to hold a pipe up with lots of holes in it filling it with water, and then build a dog house. After that we all had to put an electric fence post in a line and we all had to run a tire through it, catch frankfurts and run back to the dog house to feed the dog, run the hay bale back to the start and the last game was to crack a whip. Terry's Galoots were way ahead of all the teams!!







After everyone had a go at it they announced the winner of the North Coast National Young Farmers Challenge 2015. Everyone was in a line waiting to hear who had won. Ellie from Generation AG said the winners are "TERRY's GALOOTS"!!! Us!!! We were an all-girls team who had just smashed the boys!!! They weren't too happy to have lost to an all-girls team. We received trophies and some prize money, so we decided to head off onto some rides.

Saturday 24th the final day. It's always an unhappy day because that's the day we have to pack up and go home! But firstly the junior paraders' had to lead for other cattle exhibitors. We weren't so lucky in this event, but there's always next year!! The over judge was amazed with Macksville High's team speech, which was made up of 3 students, Wezz, Katie and Mark. All 3 students spoke well and did the Macksville High School Cattle Team proud!

Unfortunately, we didn't come first in the Schools' events but we soldiered on and took home second place!!

Finally, the announcement of the Best Steer Carcass, where we took home first and third place and received ribbons and trophy. This was a tremendous effort to have won when you consider that there were at least 70 other steers competing for the best carcass.

A massive shout out goes to Tony Styles, Jayne Cooper and Ken Whalen for helping us all out over the 4 days we were away.

Thank you to Terry Argent on behalf of Megan, Katie, Elouise, Wezz, Tylor, Mark, Angus, JD and David for giving us the opportunity to attend the North Coast Nationals and doing the Macksville High School Cattle Team proud!!


YEAR 12 HSC VISUAL ARTS



ALCOHOL AND YOUNG PEOPLE

Alcohol and Young People

Whilst more young people aged between 12 to 17 years of age are abstaining from alcohol than in previous years¹, almost 5 million people in Australia aged 14 or older (26%) reported being a victim of an alcohol-related incident²



Young people are less likely than adults to be concerned about potential negative consequences of alcohol and are at greater risk than adults (being both physically and psychologically vulnerable).

Current research suggests the brain is not fully developed until about 25 years of age. Binge drinking alcohol during adolescence can result in permanent brain damage³, affecting memory, learning, decision making and problem solving.

Recognising the serious impact of alcohol on young people, NSW Office of Liquor and Gaming have changed the laws regarding supply of alcohol to young people. Under Section 117 of the New South Wales Liquor Act 2007 it is illegal to supply alcohol to people aged under 18 years in a private home unless it is supplied by:

- the child's parent or guardian, or
- an adult who had the approval of the child's parent or guardian.

A person convicted of secondary supply in NSW can be fined up to \$11 000 for each underage drinker involved.

WHOOPING COUGH INFORMATION FOR SCHOOLS

There is an outbreak of whooping cough (pertussis) in NSW, mainly affecting school-aged children.

Coughing spreads the infection to others nearby. Whooping cough can spread to anyone at home, including younger brothers and sisters. Whooping cough can be especially dangerous for babies.

Whooping cough starts like a cold and progresses to bouts of coughing that can last for many weeks. The infection can occur even in fully-vaccinated children. Older children may just have a cough that is persistent and may be worse at night.



- Children with these symptoms should see a doctor.
- If your doctor diagnoses whooping cough in your school-aged child, please let the school know and keep your child at home until they have taken 5 days of antibiotics.
 Keep coughing children away from babies.
- Whooping cough vaccines give good protection against infection but immunity fades
 with time. Check that all your children are up to date with their vaccines, due at 6
 weeks, 4 months, 6 months, 4 years and 12 years of age (offered to all Year 7
 students through the NSW school-based vaccination program). A booster is also
 recommended at 18 months of age.

A booster dose of vaccine is also recommended for adults that are in contact with young children, such as school staff and parents. Pregnant women are recommended to have a booster dose during each pregnancy and this is funded by NSW Health. Those who are new parents or carers of babies should consult their general practitioner about appropriate immunisation.


