





















MORE ARTEFACTS FOR YEAR 12 MODERN HISTORY

We are fortunate war memorabilia is still available in markets and second hand shops in the local area. The artefacts vividly reinforce images of a struggle now one hundred years in the past. At the *Rusty Iron Rally* I found the Australian Imperial Forces Insignia and the German 'Hindenburg' Active Service Medal. The Air Raid Precautions Handbook No.3 'Medical Treatment of Gas Casualties' is a 1st Edition from 1937. It reflects the ongoing concerns of the use of poison gas in battle amid increasing fears of the outbreak of another world war.

The Queenslanders went into these titles with a mental edge knowing they have dominated this competition for many years.


Nick did a magnificent job, growing in confidence with each game he was allocated. He was awarded lead referee roles in two finals. An outstanding achievement particularly for his age!


