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


IT'S MACKSVILLE SHOWTIME!





FROM THE PRINCIPAL



Dear Parents and Community,

Welcome back to term 2. Firstly I would like to thank our students and staff who represented our school by attending the ANZAC Day march at Macksville. Although it was a wet march, I was pleased to see so many of our students taking time out of their holiday to attend.

Throughout this term all students will be engaged with a range of assessment tasks and exams which will form the basis of the semester one reports, as well as the NAPLAN testing for years 7 and 9. It is important that all students are actively

participating in these assessments and striving towards their personal best. Year 12 has just received their mid-course reports and I would encourage all students to heed the advice given, and continue to prepare themselves for the workload ahead. We do offer a significant amount of support for our senior students to assist if they are feeling overwhelmed in any way.

One of the greatest predictors of success is full attendance at school. It is important that students commit to their studies and make the most of the time they have at school to enable them to be proud of their achievements in all years. SMS messages go out to parents and carers after roll call, which is now a part of period one. If we do not have your details, or they have changed, could you please contact the school.

Our staff development day at the beginning of term focussed on the School Excellence Framework, gathering evidence and evaluating where we are as a school against the Framework elements of Learning, Teaching and Leading. The staff have also been participating in extended staff meetings focusing on assessment and adjustments, and reflecting on the assessment practices across the school. These sessions have provided valuable professional discussions across faculties and sharing of ideas.

In closing my final report, I need to reflect on the two main issues facing us as a P&C at this point. In the past we have been able to contribute quite considerable funds from the Canteen to support the educational requirements of our kids, but over the last few years our profits have been dropping as staffing costs increase due to fewer volunteers being available. We have also struggled a number of times over the last year to reach a quorum in our meetings. Both of these issues are two sides of the same thing, namely a dropping off in parental/carer engagement in P&C activities and many other areas of school life. SCHOOL CAPTAINS' INTRODUCTION TO POLITICS



It was with great pleasure that I accompanied Elizabeth Argue and Trent Stack to visit the Parliament House and Government House in Sydney on the 6.30 am plane last Thursday morning. We met up with the captains from Bowraville Central School accompanied by Lynden Briggs and the captains from Nambucca High, once we boarded our flight.

The students were introduced to a number of parliamentarians from regional NSW, including Melinda Pavey, our local member from the Oxley Electorate. A number of students asked questions of the members relating to issues such as drugs, disability support funding, the impact of mining on communities, sexual abuse, out of home care, the impact of technology on society, connect classrooms and selective high schools.

One of the members stressed how important the art of "coding" is today. He encouraged students to study and develop this skill, as it is the way of the future. He gave the example of the rail system, explaining that

trains are to become driverless, but the need for people to program the trains is another area of employment that will open up. His slogan of the day was "If it is to be, it's up to me."

The students were given a run down on the difference between the upper and lower Houses of Parliament, before moving to the next room where the discussion was in relation to the "double jeopardy" ruling in Law.

After a break for lunch the students walked down Macquarie Street, past the Conservatorium High school, which was originally built to be used as the Governor's stables, to Government House. The Governor's right hand man told the students about his role and that of the Governor of NSW. He explained that the Governor was involved in matters of the Constitution, Ceremony and Community.

We were guided through the beautiful rooms of Government House, amazed at the portraits of past Governor's hanging in the foyer, the grand old Grandfather clock, the tables and chairs made from imported oak, the chandeliers hanging from each ceiling, the heavy drapes either side of the windows and the paintings on the ceilings that represented the four seasons, and much more.


Governor Hurley and his wife were introduced to the students and answered many questions before mingling outside on the terrace for afternoon tea. We parted company and walked down to Circular Quay to view the Opera House and the Harbour Bridge, before catching a train back to the airport.

STATE SWIMMING SUCCESS

Macksville High students attended the 2016 Combined High Schools (CHS) State Swimming Championships at Homebush from April 3-5.

At his last CHS Swimming Championships, competing in the 17-19 years age group Tannah Bradshaw claimed two individual medals. Tannah received bronze medal in both the 200m and 400m medley events. He was also a finalist in the 50m and 200m freestyle, the 100m butterfly and the 100m backstroke. Tannah has been a great ambassador for swimming at Macksville High both as an individual swimmer and as the anchor of many of our relay teams. Next year we will really miss his enthusiasm, happy disposition and of course, his talent.



Declan Sutton also had an outstanding meet, claiming an individual medal in the 100m backstroke. Declan flew in from the National Age Championships in Adelaide the night before the meet and went on to swim in 14 races at the championships. Overall Declan competed in seven finals and just missing out on other medals. Declan was also a finalist in the 200 and 400m individual medleys, 50m, 100m and 200m freestyle and 100m butterfly.

Kyran Tsujimoto had a very busy meet competing in eight individual events and two relays. Kyran's hard work was rewarded when he was presented with a North Coast Achievement Award, an Eyeline swim package.

In their first trip to a high school state carnival Kate Payne and Kellie Tsujimoto performed well in individual events. Kate and Kellie both competed in the 100m backstroke and butterfly.

Macksville High also had three relay teams compete at the meet. All of the teams swam well. Tannah, Kyran and Declan were joined by Heath Galvin to compete in the Medley Relay where they finished fifteenth in an open event. In the 15 years relay Kyran, Declan and Heath were joined by Ryan Atkins and they narrowly missed the final finishing in eleventh place as did the 13 girls 200m freestyle relay where Kate and Kellie were joined by Abby Baxter and Gemma Summerville.

Special mention must be made of the parents who took the students to the meet and got up with them in the morning to take them to training! Thanks also to the staff at Macksville Aquatic Centre for preparing our students to compete at these events.

Year 12 Hospitality students have been busy honing their hospitality skills at 'Macks's Café'!



PARENT INFORMATION

EXCEL HSC SURVIVAL GUIDES

The Pascal Press publishing company donated 80 copies of a very worthwhile HSC Survival guide for our Year 12 students. It has a yearly planner as well as motivational suggestions, study skills, essay writing techniques, how to cope with stress, pages to jot down your long and short term goals and suggestions on how families can survive this important time in the life of a senior student on the verge of completing their school studies. Encourage your child to utilise this valuable resource.

ABSENCES

A reminder to please respond promptly to the schools SMS' advising of absences and partial absences to avoid any unexplained absences on your student's records.

SUBJECT FEES

Invoices were forwarded mid Term 1. If you are having difficulty in paying subject fees, we have limited financial student assistance that may be able to help you (forms available from the school office). You can also pay instalments during the year.

DRIVING STUDENTS TO EXCURSIONS AND SPORTING EVENTS

There is a new Statutory Declaration to complete, which has to be witnessed by an 'authorised witness', for parents/carers volunteering to drive students to excursions, sporting events, etc., along with a 100 point proof of identity (even if you have a Working with Children Check number as we still have to comply with the Department of Education's policy on child protection). This only needs to be completed once while your student remains at MHS. We also need to sight the originals of your licence and registration papers.

While we are very grateful for our parent/carer helpers, and appreciate that there is often late notice involved with arrangements, it is a legal requirement that the school will have the correct paperwork *fully completed* before the excursion/event. If you have already completed a previous Declaration, you will not be required to complete this new Statutory Declaration but may need to update your licence and registration details when you next volunteer.

VISITING THE SCHOOL

All visitors (including parents), are to present at the reception area in the school's office. Please do not enter other buildings/rooms without gaining permission to do so.

PARKING AND PICKING UP STUDENTS

Parents and carers please be aware of the restricted parking times and bus areas outside the front of the school in Boundary Street. Fines have been issued recently to parents dropping off and picking up students.

Bus zone times in front of the school are 8.00 am - 9.00 am in the mornings and 2.30 pm - 4.00 pm in the afternoons. Parking across from the front of the school is prohibited 8.00 am - 9.00 am in the mornings and 3.15 pm - 4.00 pm in the afternoons.
