O Declan Sutton - Australia National Swimming Championships

Declan has just returned from Melbourne where he competed in the School Sports Australia National Swimming Championships.

Declan was selected in the New South Wales Swimming Team after his performance at the NSW All School Championships held in Sydney in May.

At the SSA National Championships he competed in the 17-19's age division, swimming against competitors from all the other States in Australia. He swam in the 50m Backstroke heats and made it through to the finals later that evening, he placed 4th in the finals, just missing a medal by 16 100th of a second.

Declan was selected in four NSW relay teams, his Men's 17-19 Medley team won Silver, with Declan swimming the first leg (Backstroke), he swam a personal best time of 27.41 seconds. In the Mixed 17-19 Medley relay Declan again swam the Backstroke leg with their team winning a Bronze for their efforts. Another Bronze was won in the Men's 17-19 Freestyle relay with Declan swimming the 3rd leg of the relay in a time of 24.60 seconds. Declan swam another Backstroke leg in the Mens 13-19 Handicap relay with them placing 7th overall.

Declan was very proud to be representing Macksville High School at these Championships and received lots of support from family and friends who were watching him race on the livestreaming of his events.

Marli achieved 2^{nd} place on bars and 2^{nd} place overall as an Individual. Marli was also part of the NSW North Coast team which came first.



SCIENCE - JUNIOR BIOLOGY

Year 8 and 9 Science students explored body systems with a cow pluck with the help of Mr Luke Smith. The pluck had a long trachea pipe, like a vaccum hose leading to the lungs. Brave students had a turn at inflating the lungs by blowing through a plastic pipe into the trachea. Most students declined the opportunity to have a go, but were intrigued to watch the lungs expand. Tucked under the lungs was a large liver. The different lobes of the liver were evident and led to a discussion about live donor transplants, as the liver is one of the few organs that can regenerate. Attached to the liver was a rather gross looking yellow sack of gooey bile called the gall bladder. Noone was keen to poke that too hard! The heart was huge and was hiding under a fat laden membrane.

Year 8 students will have the opportunity to dissect a heart to explore the inner chambers and valves that allow the heart to pump blood. There was a kidney too. It took some cutting to expose it from beneath a thick fatty layer. It was facinating to see how the organs fitted together.




PCYC SAFER DRIVER COURSE


If you hold a valid NSW Learner Licence, are under 25 years of age and have completed a minimum of 50 hours actual on-road driving then you are eligible to attend the Safer Driver Course run by PCYC Kempsey. The course's aim is to help young people develop safer driving practices and skills so they are better prepared for when they transition to solo driving. The Safer Driver Course counts towards 20 hours of Learner Driver Logbook time and provides strategies for dealing with road risks and provides guidance to prevent risk taking behavior. Topics covered include safe driving distances, crash avoidance, speed management and hazard identification. These strategies are a great asset for young drivers who are transitioning to unsupervised driving, better preparing them for the potential situations and conditions that may face them during their driving. The course is educational, enjoyable and will help you drive more safely.

C O M M U N I T Y N E W S G'DAY USA PROGRAM

The G'Day USA Program is a short-term cultural exchange which offers Australian students and staff the opportunity to travel as a group to the USA during the January school holidays. The program includes a cultural home stay with an American host family in some beautiful parts of the United States, whilst exploring all the local attractions and spending time going to a local American High School. The world-famous cities of Los Angeles and San Francisco are then explored, including visits to the Golden Gate Bridge, San Francisco Bay, Los Angeles premier surf beaches, Anaheim theme parks and a day trip to San Diego!

G'Day USA is generally the first step for young Australians to become true global citizens, as the program fosters greater cultural awareness, teaches tolerance for other people and promotes understanding and openness to new ideas.

Educational World Travel (EWT) operates the tour based on over 30 years' experience in the student travel space and provides all necessary support and resource materials to ensure a seamless experience. Pre-tour, EWT informs the students of the opportunity to travel and then conducts a Parent Information Evening to explain the program in detail to any interested parents and students.

For every ten travellers, EWT will cover one Group Leader's tour cost inclusions. This means all you need is some spending money for some meals and optional activities and an appetite for adventure!

EWT aims to minimise the workload for each Group Leader throughout the planning and organising stages of the program as well as during the tour. EWT is responsible for all group tour operations and administrative tasks, including travel arrangements, hotels, transfers, travel insurance, sightseeing tours and entrance fees. EWT also offers resource materials to Group Leaders which are helpful in preparing student groups for the tour. EWT can support schools with completing risk assessments on request.

Our Program Development Managers are available to meet with principals, heads of school and staff, along with students and their families to discuss all aspects of our touring programs (including travel insurance, visas etc.).

Taking part in the G'Day USA 20-day program includes the following opportunities; -

- A home stay with an American family (host brother or sister) from a selected American high school
- Attendance at an American high school for one or two days as a group
- 4 days of sightseeing and exploring the group's chosen host city
- Los Angeles sightseeing and Anaheim theme parks Disneyland, Universal Studios & Knott's Berry Farm
- San Francisco city tour and walk the Golden Gate Bridge
- Pier 39 and Union Square
- Day tour of San Diego

Living with an American family provides young Australians with a greater awareness of the differences between our cultures and is often the highlight of the tour for our travellers. Additionally, the educational benefits and learning gained from attending school classes in America is invaluable.

The program is invaluable in providing students with a greater sense of responsibility, self-reliance and self-esteem. Travellers return with an increased awareness of the importance of working cohesively in a team environment.
